## Largest Contributions & Expenditures

At Vesta, we believe in transparency and accountability. While it is legitimate for us to participate in legislative, political, and public discourse, we recognize that excessive contributions to political campaigns, lobbying expenditures, and contributions to trade associations can damage our reputation and create risks of corruption.

Vesta has two policies that regulate this type of contributions, the [Anti-Corruption Policy](#) and the [Social Investment Policy](#); where payments to political campaigns are prohibited and contributions to lobbying and contributions to trade associations are regulated.

Below, we present our annual monetary contributions and expenditures to organizations, lobbyists, trade associations, and other tax-exempt groups.
